Never Pooking Back

Through the mission, Jeremy has found firm footing in Jesus.

eremy's eyes brightened as he talked about his new church. He explained that church members pick him up on Sundays and during the week. Jeremy said "The people at church are so welcoming. One woman even gave me a hug." Later, Jeremy remembered it had been more than six years since anyone had hugged him.

Eight years ago, Jeremy was married and working three jobs to care for his family. He weighed 250 pounds and was "built" – all the better for his job as a bouncer at a Virginia Beach nightclub. But his life was disrupted when he began feeling exhausted, barely able to get out of bed. It took weeks and many tests for the doctors to determine he had a rare kidney disease. He spent a year in the hospital recovering, slowly learning to walk and care for himself again.

Life looked different after he was released from the hospital. Jeremy's wife left him and he had nowhere to go. He lived with family, but that didn't work. He spent several months living on the street. Then he moved in with friends, but they stopped paying the rent, and were all evicted. "The landlords told me they had somewhere to take me where there were meals and a bed. They were good Christian people and brought me to the Mission."

Having lost his job and his family, and suffering from a severe foot infection, Jeremy was incredibly depressed, with little hope things would improve.

"Since being at The Union" Mission, I've placed my life into the hands of God. I'm happy now."

"When I first came to The Union Mission, I was only looking for a place to put my head and a place to eat. I had no idea about all the programs and resources available for me here to better my situation."

"I didn't know how much the people at The Mission cared for me until Mr. Banks, the men's shelter director, noticed my foot infection had gotten worse." He could hardly walk. With

urging from staff, Jeremy was rushed to the hospital.

"When I got to the hospital, there was no hiding my condition. The nurses looked at my toes, and immediately told me that some toes would need to be amputated. I knew right then that my life had to change. I had to find a way to be better."

Jeremy has been hospitalized more times with additional surgeries on his feet. Initially wheelchair-bound, he has been working hard in physical therapy to learn to walk again.

"I questioned God for years. Why does God always take away everything from me that I've worked so hard for? That's when my mom, my hero, told me to talk to God." With encouragement from Mr. Banks, Jeremy has accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. He is reading the Bible daily and renewing his relationship with his family.

"I used to wake up with pain every day. Emotional, spiritual, mental. I didn't want to get out of bed. Now, since being at The Union Mission, I've placed my life into the hands of God. I'm happy now. I've given my life to Jesus and I never want to look back."

"T moved to Virginia from New Jersey after high school since my brother was here in the Navy. After my daughter was born and I split with her father, I moved back to New Jersey. I was staying with a friend, but that fell through and I went to a shelter. I hated every minute of it."

Felicia shared "Mentally, I wasn't happy in New Jersey. I was missing something. It was my church here. I have been worshipping with this church family for 18 years now and was baptized there in 1997."

"I came back and got an apartment but it was unsafe. When I got a job at an oceanfront hotel, they let me stay in a room for 2½ years. But when my boss let me go, I became homeless and jobless. My pastor took me in until I was able to get an apartment. But I live with depression and anxiety. And I wasn't taking my medication regularly so my finances just got bad and I got evicted."

"My church was like, 'Try calling the Union Mission.' The staff members here are some of the kindest and most understanding people I have ever met. The food is great and the facility well taken care of. I've met some amazing people."

Felicia worked for a local construction company while staying at The Mission and has moved into transitional housing. She credits the Women's Shelter staff with getting her back on track. "I didn't like all the rules when I first came – getting up and dressed at 7 am and a 'lights out' time, but this structure has been so good for me. I've stayed on my medication for the longest time ever. And my relationship with my mother and 14-year-old daughter is better than it ever has been. My mom told me 'You're the happiest I've heard you in a long time.'"

"I have been a Christian and have loved the Lord for years. I have always loved art. But recently I have not felt inspired. After only a few days here, I realized my love for God was greater than I could ever imagine. I closed my eyes to pray and saw a beautiful image. The sun was setting. There were two cliffs, with water in between. On one side, there stood a cross with the sun setting right behind it. On the other side, there were people worshiping the goodness of God. I got my iPad and started recreating that very image." "Without the Union Mission, I wouldn't have been able to reclaim my passion for art."

"Someone once told me, 'Your struggles are your story, and your story is your superpower.' Being homeless is part of my story. It may only be a small chapter, but it will have a lasting impact."


