

## Darriyona finally had enough!

Pregnant, scared, and homeless, Darriyona's aunt helped her look for shelters."I called the Union Mission. And the next day, I was here. Living in my car and staying at different hotels was not good at all. I needed something stable. I was so scared. I didn't have anywhere to go. So, when I arrived here, the weight lifted from my shoulders was incredible. Relief. Happiness. Sure, there was some unknowns because the shelter life was new to me, but all the worries just went away. I was safe. I felt so welcomed when I got here in October of 2024."

"The encouragement to get closer to God has been the most important thing for me. I've been trying to do that my whole life. I remember being discouraged in my relationship with God when I was living out of my car. It's not like I didn't believe in God anymore, but my faith was really weak.

Staff here really encouraged me to be in the Bible, because that will keep me closer to God. Now, I love it. Every morning, I go to Bible study at the women's shelter, and every night, I study it on my own. Even on my days off work, I love spending most of the day learning more about God. I feel like I'm more consistent and content in His Word. The more you spend time in God's Word, the stronger your relationship with Him will be.

It changes you. When I first got here, I would lash out in anger. But the more I spent time in God's Word, the less I would be angry. It's not a quick process, but there's so much growth in my life. Life won't be perfect, it never

is. But my faith in God is deep despite what happens. I'm a new person"

"It's hard to be selfish when there's so much to be thankful for here. I had to get to the point where I realized that I have a roof over my head, clothes, food, a shower, and amazing relationships with the staff and other guests - and just be grateful. I've learned how to save my money. Saving my money allows me to prepare and take care of what God gives me. I've also learned to view people like God views them. To have compassion."

"Why should you support The Union Mission? You're helping other people in so many ways. I really believe every single part of this place is God's work. It's a blessing. People come with nothing, but leave full. The smallest gift is amazing to someone who doesn't have anything."

Darriyonna is not only thankful for The Union Mission but also for her new baby. She gave birth to her little girl a few weeks early so the baby stayed in the NICU for the first week. The Ladies Auxiliary and staff gave her a baby shower. "I literally have everything I need. I have a car seat, a pack-n-play, diapers, everything. I've been taken care of, and it's a good feeling to know that my baby has all she needs. I've felt really loved here, for myself and the baby. The staff loves me. I know that God loves me." Both mother and baby are now thriving at home together in the Grace Place shelter.



## Eric considers The Mission a springboard to a new life.

Just seeing how God has moved in my life since the beginning has been incredible. I'm truly at a loss for words." Eric observed.

"During my initial time in jail, my mother passed away. Her last visit, she said, 'I love you, Eric.' Something about the way she said it, I knew this might be the last time I would talk with her. A week later, she was gone. I learned the only way to have peace of mind was to be in the Word of God. My mom instilled that in me, and my relationship with God slowly began to grow. Mom planted the seed, God did the rest."

A year later, Eric was acquitted of the charge and returned to his family. But he soon found himself apathetic, snowballing into severe consequences. "I got back to my family, but I got too comfortable being at home and I fell into a bad lifestyle. "Instead of being thankful for my family and a good job, I turned to drug distribution. I would drop our newborn baby with my wife in the evenings and then work the streets at night with drugs."

Friday, February 11th, 2011, while Eric was making a drug transaction, he was arrested. "Thankfully, I'm alive to tell about the story. They found drugs in my possession. I was again incarcerated, this time without bond, for the possession and intent to distribute cocaine. Life came to a crashing halt, but I'm convinced God had me arrested and placed into prison to get me out of that situation."

"Just seeing how God has moved in my life ... has been incredible. I'm truly at a loss for words."

"Nothing really went according to plan. My wife ended up divorcing me. I wasn't the man I should have been at all. But God brought a guy in there who knew the Lord. He knew the Bible. We had lots of Bible studies right there in the cells. It made me so thankful for God and for the Bible and those good relationships."

During those 13 years, Eric moved around to different prisons, but always applied himself wherever he was as his relationship with God grew. He even received a culinary arts certification.

While incarcerated, he learned about The Union Mission. "I was released in September 2024. I really didn't have anywhere else to go. So, I arrived at The Union Mission September 11, 2024. When I shared my story, the staff prayed over me. They were patient, listened to me. They represent God and Jesus very well. Those relationships I have built are definitely a blessing. I thank God daily for the people that God uses here, for the money that's being used to help people like me. This place is a springboard to a new life for me. Three nutritious meals a day is truly amazing. The clothing vouchers they give you to get the stuff you need is awesome. The list could go on and on. It doesn't feel like a shelter."

Since being at The Mission, Eric has continued to work with Norfolk's Second Chances program for exoffenders. Eric is extremely focused on restoring his relationship with his sons. He enjoys his work at Bauer Compressor Inc. "Some people might view you as at the bottom of the pole, but I feel like I'm on top of the world because of this place."

to maximize your impact, and maybe your tax deductions!

You may have completed and filed your taxes for 2024. But have you ever wondered is it worth donating to charity for tax savings?



When you donate to a charity, you can feel good about contributing to a need in your community. Additionally, if you itemize, you can also use your charitable donations to reduce your tax bill. A win-win! The amount you can deduct in a given year is subject to limits, but you can carry forward some of those unused deductions over a period of five years, again subject to eligibility.

## Is it time to strategize your 2025 charitable giving to maximize your tax deductions?

Here are some ways you may be able to impact your taxes and make a lasting difference in the lives of men, women and children at The Union Mission:



**Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD):** People age 70.5 or older can rollover up to \$108,000 from their IRA directly to charities like The Union Mission. This may lower your income and taxes.



**Donor Advised Fund (DAF):** Make a tax-deductible gift to a DAF which then allows you to make grants to The Union Mission and other charities this year and in the future.

**Gifts of Appreciated Assets:** Make a gift of stock, real estate, or another asset, avoid paying capital gains tax on the transfer and receive a tax-saving charitable deduction.



**Beneficiary Designation:** Designate The Union Mission as a full or partial beneficiary of your IRA/401k or life insurance.
